

US Dress Code

Students are expected to be neat, clean, well-groomed and appropriately dressed when attending school. School is a student's workplace, and students should dress for that context. All clothing should be in good repair with no rips or tears, and undergarments should not be visible. Students are expected to respect the *spirit* of the code, not simply the letter of the code. The School reserves the right to send an inappropriately dressed student home for a change of clothes and/or require that appropriate clothes be brought from home.

- Tops

Collared shirts or turtlenecks

Appropriately fitted collared or uncollared blouses/dress shirts (no t-shirts)

Sleeveless blouses/dress shirts with thick straps, no spaghetti straps or strapless

Button down shirts must be buttoned

No see-through material or tightly fitted shirts

No undergarment should be visible, and midriffs should be covered

- Pants/Shorts/Skirts

All pants/shorts must be worn at the waist/hip

Shorts, skirts and tunics must reach mid-thigh

Shorts/skirts/pants must not be tight fitting

No gym shorts, cut offs, sweat pants, yoga pants/jeggings (with/without pockets)

Tights or leggings may be worn with a mid-thigh tunic/top. (All leggings must be opaque; no sheer panels)

- Outerwear

Sweatshirts (CCDS and plain) and sweaters

Pullover crew/¼ zip/hooded sweater or sweatshirt can be worn with no collar underneath

Non-religious Headwear may not be worn in the school building

- Shoes

Casual, comfortable shoes including athletic shoes

No open toe shoes or flip-flops or backless sandals

- Formal Dress Days

Jackets/ ties/skirts/dresses/dress pants

No athletic shoes or flip-flops

Modesty of dress is expected for all
