# Part 1: Pick a Concentration to Explore – 10 points

- Start your summer by WRITING down your intended topic. "My concentration is..."
- OR if you aren't ready to choose one, pick 3 to start exploring.
- A WRITTEN statement, minimum of one sentence, maximum of one paragraph.
- Due first day of class

# Part 2: Sketchbook - 100 points

### Rules

- 1. Take it everywhere.
- 2. Put the date on every page you START.
- 3. Write or draw in it every day.
- 4. Make it reflect YOU. Your experiences, thoughts, feelings, and observations.
- 5. At LEAST three quarters of every page MUST be based on DIRECT OBSERVATION or your OWN PHOTO references (photos you took yourself).
- 6. Explore your Concentration Topic for about ½ your work or more.
- 7. Do not make "perfect" drawings. Make imperfect drawings; make mistakes; make false starts.
- 8. Always fill the page you are working on. Go off the edges whenever possible. Do not make dinky little drawings in the center of the page.
- 9. NO WHITE BACKGROUNDS!
- 10. Do not start something and abandon it. Go back later, change it, and make it into something else. Rescue bad beginnings... mistakes are opportunities for creativity!
- 11. Always finish what you start, no matter how much you don't like it.
- 12. Fill 20 pages by the start of school.
- 13. Include: continuous contours, gesture drawing, still life subjects, places, the things, people, and animals around you, abstract shapes and patterns, doodles, writing
- 14. Due on the FIRST DAY of class.

## Part 3: Ambitious Work – 100 points

- Based on sketchbook work, AND/OR create separate planning sketches.
- Based on Concentration Topic
- Between 8x10 and 18x24 (The size of Quality work).
- In keeping with AP Rubric strong design principles, technical skills, risk-taking, originality, and PERSONAL VOICE!
- Due on the FIRST Day of Class. Edits may be made within one week.

# Part 4: Collect References – 100 points

- 3 or more 3-D objects related to your topic.
- 20 or more photographs YOU took related to your topic.
- Due on the FIRST Day of class.
