

GENERAL INFORMATION

CCDSummer Programs are located on Cincinnati Country Day School's beautiful 62-acre campus. The campus features expansive athletic fields, gymnasiums, performing arts theater, all-weather track, multi-age playgrounds, dining facility, 25-yard, 6-lane pool, 7-court tennis complex, amphitheater, hiking trails, playscape, and natural outdoor classrooms.

Whatever your interests — from technology, arts, or sports to day camps — *CCDSummer* programs offer opportunities for children ages 10 months – adults.

Programs run during the months of June through August. Course offerings and day camps have been scheduled to allow you to develop a summer schedule full of excitement, fun, and personal growth!

- *CCDSummer* Programs has partnered with Get Sharp Soccer, Cincinnati Museum Center, Connections Academics, Drobots Company, and NIKE Basketball Camps.
- Camp and class sizes are limited, and registration is on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Placement is based on entering grade/program for the upcoming school year or age by June 1st.
- Course enrollment will be evaluated two weeks prior to the start date (30 days for courses for credit) to determine if enrollment is enough for the course to proceed. *CCDSummer* Programs reserves the right to cancel any course that has insufficient enrollment. Should a course be cancelled, registrants will receive a full refund of course fees paid.
- Day camp and Summer PE registrants must have a Student Medical Record Form on file prior to the first day of camp/course. Current CCDS students are exempt.
- The Lower School building, Early Childhood Center, and a designated area in the Dining Terrace are zoned “nut-free” to accommodate those with severe nut allergies.

ACADEMIC COURSES

A Bug's Life

Grades 1 - 4

Dates: 7/15/2019 – 7/19/2019

Times: 9:00 AM – Noon

Instructors: Connections Academics

Course Fee: \$225

Description: In this course, students will learn what makes an insect an insect. They will explore campus to find different insects and make observations about the various species. They will learn about insects that live to stay hidden and their use of camouflage. They will also learn about the life cycles of insects that live in their own backyards. Students will act as researchers and draw what they see around campus to help increase their observational skills.

Advanced Adventure Camp

Grades 3 - 6

Description: Campers will make use of CCDS's 62-acre campus to practice and improve their executive functioning skills. Campers will take age-appropriate risks to help them recognize their own strengths and weaknesses while working to achieve a goal. Activities will boost creativity and promote a healthy sense of fear.

K – Grade 4

Curious Coders Camp for Girls

Dungeons & Dragons

Grades 5 - 8

Course Fee: \$175

Description: Dungeons & Dragons is one of the first role-playing fantasy games, in which players are characters in an ongoing fantasy story. The core of D&D is storytelling. Players tell a story together, guiding heroes through quests for treasure, battles with deadly foes, daring rescues, courtly intrigue, and much more. Players can also explore the world of Dungeons & Dragons through any of the novels written by its fantasy authors, as well as engaging board games and immersive video games. All of these stories are part of D&D.

During the course of play, players direct their characters' actions and interactions with other characters. This activity is performed through the verbal impersonation of the characters by the players, while employing a variety of social and cognitive skills, such as logic, mathematics, problem solving, strategy, statistics, and imagination. Games can last a couple of hours or for years and are ultimately resolved when the final challenge/goal is achieved.

The only items required to play the game are the rulebooks, a character sheet for each player, and a number of polyhedral dice (provided by the instructor).

Geometry *Course for Credit*

Students Entering Grade 10 (unless otherwise approved by instructor)

Course Fee: \$2,400

Description: This full-length Geometry course meets the 1 credit Geometry requirement at Cincinnati Country Day School. The primary focus of the course is geometric investigation, hypothesis formation and proof. This is the first course where students are introduced to the formal nature of mathematical proof. The major topics in the course are: congruence, similarity, circles, polygons, parallelism, area, and volume.

COURSE CREDIT: This full-length Geometry course meets the 1 credit Geometry requirement at Cincinnati Country Day School. Failure to meet the course requirements listed below may result in a student not earning credit.

COURSE STRUCTURE: The course will combine an online curriculum with classroom work. There will be 15 total class meetings. Students are expected to spend 1 hour completing the online curriculum for every 1 hour of class time. Classes will meet three times a week for a total of 12 hours per week, and students are expected to work online for a minimum of 12 hours per week.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: In order to receive credit for this course, the following requirements must be met:

- A student must spend a minimum of 120 total hours (classroom and online) on course work.
- A student must earn a final grade of a C- or higher.
- A student may miss no more than 1 class meeting (with instructor's approval).

Handwriting and Phonics Bootcamp

K – Grade 1

Description: In this course, we will use the "Handwriting Without Tears" curriculum to guide our multi-sensory approach to writing. This camp will review proper letter formation and strategies to develop writing skills. Also, we will review letter sounds and blending words, essential phonics skills to help build a strong foundation for early literacy. Handwriting and phonics activities will be hands on, and the children will actively learn throughout the afternoon while engaged in various sensory modalities.

Health Studies *Course for Credit*

Grades 9 - 12

Course Fee: \$800

Description: Students will explore various aspects related to physical, psychological, and emotional health as stipulated by the Ohio Department of Education. The course will include the following areas of study, which are mandated by the State:

- Nutritive value of foods
- Harmful effects of and legal restrictions against the use of drugs of abuse, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco
- Sexually transmitted disease education
- Dating violence prevention

Non-CCDS students should check with their school to determine if the course is accepted for credit prior to registering.
CCDS 9th graders may not take this course.

COURSE STRUCTURE: This intensive course combines an online curriculum with classroom work that includes numerous assignments, a comprehensive final exam, and a research component. Students are expected to complete the online component independently.

COURSE CREDIT: Students earn .5 credit, which satisfies the requirements set forth by the State of Ohio. Sixty contact hours are required of students to receive course credit. Failure to meet the course requirements below may result in the student not receiving credit for the course.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: To receive credit for this course, the following requirements must be met:

- A student must spend a minimum of 60 total hours (classroom and online) on course work.
- A student must earn a C- (70%) or higher for the course.

A student may miss no more than 1 class meeting (with instructor's approval).

Junior Drone Pilots

- Camp and class sizes are limited, and registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Early registration is encouraged. Course fees will be refunded if the registrant cannot be scheduled in a program due to space constraints.
- Placement is based on entering grade/program for the upcoming school year or age by June 1st.
- Course enrollment will be evaluated two weeks prior to the start date (30 days for courses for credit) to determine if enrollment is enough for the course to proceed. CCD Summer Programs reserves the right to

cancel any course that has insufficient enrollment. Should a course be cancelled, registrants will receive a full refund of course fees paid.

- A \$25 non-refundable registration fee is required for each participant. One and only one such registration fee is ultimately payable per person registered. Where necessary we will separately charge or credit your credit card account so that the total registration fee per person registered is exactly \$25.00.
- Payment in full by credit card, debit card, or e-check is due at the time of registration. The sole exception to this policy is that CCDS faculty and staff members may pay by paper check.
- We accept MasterCard, Visa, Discover, American Express, and e-checks (ACH).
- Cancellations must be submitted in writing (email) 14 days prior to the start of a program. Cancellations made prior to 14 days of the starting date of a program will result in a 90% refund of the program fee.
- Cancellations made within 13 days or fewer of the start date of a program will result in no refund.
- No refunds will be issued for withdrawals for any reason, including illness, within two weeks of the program start date.
- There are no pro-rated fees or make-up days given for missed days.
