Grade Weighting

Each Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) course receives +1 point in GPA weighting. **Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) courses are EQUIVALENT and extremely rigorous.** These courses extend well beyond AP exam content and challenge our students to understand, create and express knowledge in multiple ways. Admission to Honors and AP courses is subject to departmental approval. Students are encouraged to limit the number they take.

Remote Learning during the COVID-19 Pandemic

Country Day classes moved online in March 2020 with live synchronous instruction. **Final letter grades for 2019-20 reflect student work in all four quarters of the year.** Students received grades of HP/P/LP/F for the fourth quarter ONLY of the 2019-2020 school year, and those marks were included in the calculation of their final grades.

Country Day reopened in August 2020 with in-person classes and traditional letter grading. Some students have chosen to participate remotely. Students are now required to be in assigned seats in proctored spaces throughout the day. Twice-weekly assemblies, student-run clubs and school-sponsored social gatherings have been cancelled. Sports teams compete without spectators.

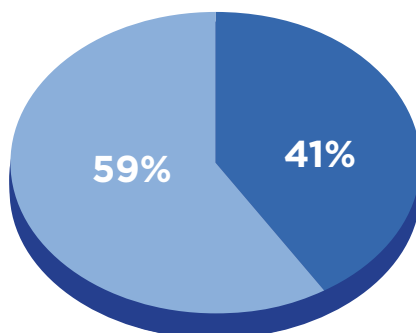

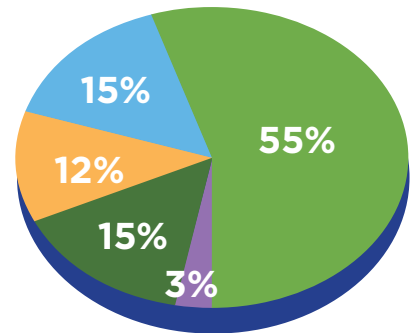
